

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE BOARDROOM

These are the highlights from the March 2, 2022, regular board meeting. All board members were in attendance. In addition to routine actions, the board voted to appoint Director Smith as the temporary MREA delegate for the MREA annual meeting, to approve moving the May board meeting to May 10, 2022, and to accept the 2021 annual cogeneration filings and reports as presented.

Staff reports included the safety report, the financial report, the review of the 2021 RUS Form 7, the 2021 capital credit allocation, the CoBank Sharing Success program, winter load control, ripple receiver inspections and repairs, rebates, new LED lighting in the Littlefork office, new service and upgrade inquiries, pole change-outs, Minnkota line maintenance projects, Koochiching County's railroad overpass construction project on the Van Lynn Road this summer, outages, truck inspections, the transition process for Tim Pelach taking over as operations manager upon the retirement of Marty Mollberg, and Minnesota and federal utility industry updates.

Detailed minutes are available at the cooperative for member review (140-18-003-01, Gordon Sorenson). Regular board meetings are generally held the first Wednesday of every month. If you

wish to speak with the board or have an item that you would like to have placed on the agenda, please contact the coop at least two weeks in advance to be included on the agenda.

STAFF REPORT – ELECTRICAL SAFETY



Robyn Sonstegard Finance Manager At North Star Electric, we recognize Electrical Safety Month every May, but we also know the importance of practicing safety year-round. From our co-op crews to you, the consumer-members we serve, we recognize that everyone has a part to play in prioritizing safety.

According to the Electrical Safety Foundation International, thousands of

people in the U.S. are critically injured or electrocuted as a result of electrical fires and accidents in their own homes. Many of these accidents are preventable. Electricity is a necessity, and it powers our daily lives (424-06-011-04, Jerry Bjork). But we know firsthand how dangerous electricity can be because we work with it 365 days a year.

At North Star, we all have responsibilities to keep our co-op employees safe. Additionally, we want to help keep you and all members of our community safe. That's why you'll see our employees hosting safety demonstrations at community events and in schools throughout the year, to demonstrate

the dangers of electricity. We discuss emergency scenarios, such as what to do in a car accident involving a utility pole and downed power lines. We caution students on the dangers of pad-mounted transformers and overloading circuits with too many electronic devices. We want kids to play it safe and smart around electricity, and to be aware of overhead power lines when they play outdoors.

Electricity is an integral part of modern life. Given the prevalence of electrical devices, tools and appliances, I'd like to pass along a few practical electrical safety tips.

- *Frayed wires pose a serious safety hazard*. Power cords can become damaged or frayed from age, heavy use or excessive current flow through the wiring. If cords become frayed or cut, replace them, as they could cause a shock when handled.
- Avoid overloading circuits. Circuits can only cope with a limited amount of electricity. Overload happens when you draw more electricity than a circuit can safely handle – by having too many devices running on one circuit.
- Label circuit breakers to understand the circuits in your home. Contact a qualified electrician if your home is more than 40 years old and you need to install multiple large appliances that consume large amounts of electricity.
- Use extension cords properly. Never plug an extension cord into another extension cord. If you "daisy chain" them together, it could lead to overheating, creating a potential fire hazard. Don't exceed the wattage of the cord. Doing so also creates a risk of overloading the cord and creating a fire hazard. Extension cords should not be used as permanent solutions. If you need additional outlets, contact a licensed electrician to help.

Our top priority is providing an uninterrupted energy supply 24/7, 365 days per year. But equally important is keeping our community safe around electricity.

HOME COOKING

Crazy meatballs

These meatballs will be a hit at potlucks and become a much requested recipe. They freeze well too if you are lucky enough to have any left!

- 3 eggs
- 1 envelope dry onion soup mix

- 1 can whole cranberry sauce
- 1 bottle of water (fill chili sauce bottle)

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Mix together hamburger, breadcrumbs, eggs, dry onion soup mix, salt and pepper.



- Shape mixture into meatballs and place in a 9x13 baking pan.
- Mix together sauerkraut, cranberry sauce, brown sugar, chili sauce and water.
- Pour sauce mixture over meatballs. Make at 350° for 1¹/₂ to 2 hours.
