

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE BOARDROOM

These are the highlights from the June 7, 2023, regular board meeting. All board members were in attendance (130-31-002-05, Emil Olson). In addition to routine actions, the board voted to approve submission of applications to CoBank's Sharing Success program for a total of \$10,000 in matching grants and to approve the purchase of the Vermeer Vactron trailer.

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ELECTRICAL SAFETY TIPS

Back-to-school month can be stressful for students AND their parents - especially when it's time for college. Gathering, organizing and packing all the necessities for the year is not ideal when trying to enjoy your last moments of sunshine and fun. As your teens get ready to venture out on their own, it's always a good idea to revisit the basics of electrical safety. Here are five electrical safety tips that will help give you and your student a little peace of mind when heading back to school.

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Keep your student safe from potential fire hazards by checking if outlets are loose, are missing a wall plate, or become too hot to touch when something is plugged in. Call the landlord or dorm official right away.

EXTENSION CORD TIP

Dorm rooms or small apartments may not have enough outlets for students to plug in all their gadgets or devices, but extension cords are only meant for temporary use. If an extension cord is needed in the dorm, urge your college-aged kids to unplug it when they are done. Consider purchasing a power-strip with an overcurrent protector - it's the perfect dorm-warming gift!

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LIGHT BULB TIP

LED bulbs use 75% less energy than traditional bulbs. If your bright student needs to replace a light bulb and they can't find the required wattage needed, always encourage them to choose an LED bulb under 60 watts and remind them to flip the switch OFF before attempting a replacement.

CHARGING CORD TIP

Did you know not all charging cords are made the same? It's tempting to purchase cheaper charging cords for a phone or gaming device, but lower prices often mean lower quality and a higher chance of malfunction. Only buy cords certified by your device's manufacturer to avoid damage to the charging port or device itself.


DAMAGED **ELECTRONICS** TIP

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The North Star Electric Community Trust board met in July to review the Operation Round Up® applications, which it received requesting funding for various programs. The board awarded \$10,550, so it was not an easy task selecting which groups would get funding and what amount they would receive. Many local programs and organizations benefit from Operation Round Up, a voluntary, member-driven fundraising program of North Star Electric Cooperative, Inc., that is designed to provide financial assistance for worthwhile projects and charities in the area. Donations are given to organizations to help make the area a more pleasant and safe place to live. All funds for Operation Round Up are contributed by the memberowners of North Star, and the money is placed into a trust fund that is separate from electric accounts. The trust is administered by its own board of directors comprised of people from across the area.

Operation Round Up directors are appointed by North Star's board members and must be members of the cooperative. The cooperative's general manager is a nonvoting member of the board.

Organizations from the area may apply for a donation from the Operation Round Up Trust. The applicant must be charitable in nature and be working to meet a need in our area. The Operation Round Up board meets twice a year and decides if an application meets the guidelines of the trust and if funds are available.

If a member chooses to be part of Operation Round Up, their bill is "rounded up" to the next highest dollar (783-33-057-01 Harold Baker). For example, if a bill is \$96.47, the computer will round up the bill to \$97. The additional 53 cents will be placed in the trust and distributed to local charitable and community-based programs.

At the July meeting, \$10,550 in Operation Round Up funds was distributed to various qualifying programs and organizations throughout the area, including:

STAFF REPORT – UPGRADES AND STANDBY GENERATORS



Greetings everyone,

I hope your summer is going well. It sure seems to be flying by. The crews are busy with summer construction on both ends, with lots of new services and upgrades in addition to our normal system improvements and maintenance.

Our contractor is busy making repairs on the damaged equipment from last year's flooding and is in the Rainy Lake area now. Then they will focus on the Kab area, then Ash river. We are hoping to get this completed before winter sets in.

We are now offering another option for a standby generator

that is called a GenerLink. This is a device that fits between the meter socket and meter. It is equipped with a transfer switch that you plug the cord into that transfers power from your generator to the home (130-08-083-04, Jesse Nelson). It is rated for 40 amps so it may not run everything, but it will keep essentials going. If you would like to know more, contact the member service department and they can answer your questions.

There has been a lot of talk lately about electric vehicles and the lack of charging opportunities in northern Minnesota. I think this is going to be a big deal in the not-so-distant future with a lot of details to work out to make sure it is done right. I had the opportunity to see a hybrid bucket truck where you drive to the worksite on the engine, shut the engine off and run the bucket on electric power. It was very interesting and I'm sure that's going to have a impact on utilities soon.

HOME COOKING

Watermelon Salad

This delicious, refreshing watermelon salad recipe is meant for hot summer days. With feta, honey, mint and lime, it's the perfect mix of savory and sweet.

INGREDIENTS	Fruit	salad dressing:			
• 6 cups seedless watermelon,		• ⅓ cup honey			
cubed	• 3 T	• 3 Tbsp lime juice or juice from			

- 1 cup strawberries, *sliced*
- ³⁄₄ cup blackberries, washed
- 1 cup blueberries, washed
- ³/₄ cup raspberries, washed
- ¼ cup fresh mint, chopped
- ¼ cup fresh basil, chopped
- ¾ cup feta cheese, *crumbled*

• 3 Tbsp lime juice or juice from two fresh limes

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. In a large bowl place all washed and prepared fruit and herbs.
- 2. Whisk together honey and fresh lime juice, and pour over top of the fruit.
- 3. Combine all ingredients together,



being careful not to break the more delicate berries (such as the blueberries and raspberries). I find this is easiest if I use my hands to mix it all together.

 Sprinkle fruit mixture with feta cheese at the very end and serve. Enjoy!

SUMMER STORM SAFETY Intense summer storms can be beautiful to watch, yet have the



ntense summer storms can be beautiful to watch, yet have the potential to be very destructive. They can arise quickly, and lightning strikes, booming thunder, and torrential rain are powerful forces that, when coming in contact with utility infrastructure, can lead to power outages and damage to equipment.

Head indoors at the first sign of lightning and invest in a surge protection device for your home electronics. Here are some lightning safety tips to keep you and your family safe:

- Stay off corded phones, computers and other electrical equipment that put you in direct contact with electricity.
- Avoid plumbing, including sinks, baths and faucets.
- Stay away from windows and doors and stay off porches.
- Immediately get off elevated areas.

- Never lie flat on the ground.
- Never shelter under an isolated tree.
- Immediately get out of and away from bodies of water.

Backup generators are great during power outages, but please be sure a licensed professional installed it through a transfer switch. Improperly wired generators can result in electricity backfeeding onto power lines, which can be incredibly dangerous for co-op lineworkers and those inside your home. Never operate a generator indoors or in confined spaces.

A good tip to remember: Keep fridges and freezers closed as much as possible during a power outage. An unopened refrigerator will safely keep food cold for about four hours; a full freezer will do so for about 48 hours.
