



HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE BOARDROOM


These are the highlights from the Aug. 30, 2023, regular board meeting. All board members were in attendance. In addition to routine actions, the board voted to approve the CliftonLarsonAllen LLP financial audit engagement.

Staff reports included the safety report, the monthly financial report, the CoBank Sharing Success matching grant awards to local fire departments, 2024 group benefit and pension rates, the August RESAP (Rural Electric Safety Achievement Program) review, new services, service upgrades, the 2024-2027 construction work plan, Power System Engineering's visit to the NOVA site to review power quality, pole testing in the Williams area, the Midcontinent broadband expansion in the Gold Shores area, weather-related outages, ripple receiver inspections and repairs, a new solar installation, rebates, off-peak installations, LP prices, ETS unit repairs, a power theft issue near Roosevelt, the Willie Wiredhand sign replacement on the Baudette headquarters building, the recent max generation event, North Star's National Night Out participation, pole attachments, the annual meeting and idle services.

A guest at the August board meeting was Alison Deelstra from NRUCFC (National Rural Utilities Cooperative Finance Corporation). She reviewed North Star's 2022 KRTA (Key Ratio Trend Analysis) report in detail, which shows favorable results consistent with North Star's

monthly and year-end financial reports (252-12-007-03, Donald Powell).

Detailed minutes are available at the cooperative for member review. Regular board meetings are generally held the first Wednesday of every month. If you wish to speak with the board or have an item that you would like to have placed on the agenda, please contact the co-op at least two weeks in advance to be included on the agenda.

At North Star Electric, we are constantly striving to improve our operational efficiency so we can provide the most reliable electric service possible for our consumer-members (that's you!).

We rely on data for nearly every aspect of our operations, which is why we need your help. By making sure we have your most accurate and complete contact information, we can continue to provide the high level of service that you expect and deserve. Accurate information enables us to improve customer service and enhance communications for reporting and repairing outages. In the future, it may also allow coop members to receive information about other load events or outages.

Up-to-date contact information can potentially speed up the power restoration process during an outage. For example, the phone number you provide is linked to your service address and our outage management system. This means when you call to report an outage, our system can recognize your phone number and match it with your account location. Accurate information helps our outage management system predict the location and possible cause of an outage, making it easier for our crews to correct the problem.

While we always do our best to maintain service, we occasionally plan outages to update, repair or replace equipment. In these instances, we can provide advance notification to affected members through automated phone messages, text messages or email — if we have your updated contact information and communication preferences.

Keeping the co-op updated with your information will also be important if a grid emergency event occurs. A grid emergency could include a lack of available generation resulting in an electricity shortfall or an

extended outage due to storm damage (716-05-051-05, Tim Trounce). If this occurs, we would want to use all communication methods possible to keep our membership informed about outage expectations.

Many of you have been members of the co-op for years, and it's likely that your account information hasn't been updated for some time. We recognize that many members now use a cellphone as their primary phone service, and we might not have that number in our system.

I want to emphasize that in providing your contact information to the co-op, we will never share this information with any third parties. It is only used by the co-op to send important information to you. Please take a moment to confirm or update your contact information by either completing the bill insert included with your October electric bill, or by calling our office at (toll free) 888-634-2202. By doing so, you will be helping us improve service and efficiency so we can better serve you and all members of the co-op! Plus, when you provide us with your contact information, you will be entered into a drawing for one of three (3) \$50 bill credits, which we will be drawing for on Dec. 15. Thank you for your assistance in keeping our records updated!



FIVE ELECTRIC Ways to Warm

The cold has finally slipped into the region, so you've likely had a chance to try out your heating system for the season. Now is a good opportunity to ask yourself these questions:

ELECTRIC TECHNOLOGY	HOW IT WORKS	SAVINGS INCENTIVES
Air-source heat pump	Unlike a furnace, an air-source heat pump (ASHP) doesn't burn fuel to make heat. It simply uses electricity to move heat from one place to another. A standard ASHP is a self-contained system that uses existing ductwork. The system is composed of an outdoor compressor unit and an indoor air handling unit.	Rebate of \$150/ton (or more) Eligible for low off-peak rate
Mini-split heat pump	Similar to an ASHP, a mini-split heat pump is run by a compressor unit placed outside of your home – but it doesn't need ductwork (242-42-019-03, Leslie Huerd). The unit is connected to an indoor unit by small cables and a refrigerant line. The indoor unit is typically mounted in the room that is being heated.	Rebate of \$150/ton (or more) Eligible for low off-peak rate
Thermal storage heater	Electric thermal storage heaters convert off-peak electricity to heat and store this low-cost heat to keep a home comfortable all day. The system contains electric heating elements that lie within specially designed, high-density ceramic bricks. When the room thermostat calls for heat, it is extracted from the unit's storage core and distributed evenly in the home.	Rebate of \$45/kW (or more) Eligible for low off-peak rate
Underfloor storage heating	Underfloor heating has quickly become a favorite for those seeking ease and comfort on chilly days. The system can be installed at construction or during renovation. Warmth rises from the floor and spreads evenly through a room, garage or shop building.	Rebate of \$25-45/kW (dependent on radiant or slab) Eligible for low off- peak rate
Electric plenum heater	Easily adapted to an existing fuel oil or gas/propane forced-air system, a plenum heater uses your existing furnace fan to move air across the plenum heater elements to heat your home. Both your fossil fuel furnace and the electric plenum heater use the same thermostat and ductwork. In most cases, a plenum heater can be installed in conjunction with an air-source heat pump.	Rebate of \$25/kW Eligible for low off- peak rate
